



There are so many things that we can give God thanks and praise for from Arise 2023. This document attempts to give a summary of some of the praise points i.e. the things that we continue to celebrate.

Teams

35 delegates from five different churches (USA, S. Korea and UK) were sent to serve on this year's Arise. This is a brilliant step up following the pandemic. We thank God for these sending churches and their continued and faithful commitment to sending teams to help (re)evangelise the UK.

3 churches hosted a team for the whole week. Two of which were new hosting churches: Flowing Rivers (Dagenham), Southall Baptist, Hope Community Church (Northwich). One team acted as an 'Ignition Team' and visited five different locations across the week encouraging churches to reach out to their local communities and to provide a taster of what an Arise Team could do.

'Results'

Whilst numbers and statistics will never be the focus of Arise mission weeks, they do provide a helpful way of reviewing and summarizing what

God has been doing though. Behind every statistic is a story; every number, a person.

 Over 3000 homes were visited over the course of the campaign with many surveys being completed. These surveys and conversations helped many consider or reconsider what they thought about Jesus and faith and a almost 400 people/homes were open to

At least 10 people turned and believed in Jesus

a follow up visit to continue the conversation and build relational connection with the hosting churches.

- Almost 200 people were prayed with on doorsteps and on the street or at events during the week.
- At least 10 people came to faith during the week. 7 in Dagenham, 1 in Reading, 2 in Watford.

- One team had the honour of leading RE lessons in a local Secondary School each day which meant that about 150 pupils heard a clear Gospel presentation.
- One team led Children's ministry each afternoon and had the opportunity to connect with hundreds of families over the course of the week.
- 10 new people showed up in one church on the Sunday morning
- So many of the Arise team members commented on how God grew things inside of them and ministered to them as they stepped out in faith sharing Him with others.
